

INSTRUCTIONS:

Number of Participants: Unlimited!

Materials:

4"x4"x8' post, 4-8 pints of paint in assorted colors, paintbrushes, pencil, posthole digger or shovel, and a level

Steps:

Dig the hole for your post about two feet into the ground and eight inches around.

Draw a line around the 4"x4" pole at 2' from the bottom to mark what part will be underground. Then find the middle of the section that will be above ground and mark that with a line too, so you can have two different colors and two different messages on each side.

Use the pencil to write what color to paint each side, and then start painting. Make sure to let each side dry properly.

Write the message "May Peace Prevail on Earth" in eight different languages. Decide which languages you would like to see represented on the Peace Pole ahead of time, and research how to write them on the internet. Use smaller brushes to paint the messages.

Let the post dry and set it in the hole, make sure it is level, and fill in the dirt around it.
